
ENGAGE AN AUDIENCE



WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

If you want people to be engaged while you speak, you need to make an effort to connect with them by creating rapport.

Whether you are presenting to a group in-person, or virtually via a webcam, it is important to bring a really **good energy** that the audience picks up on and reacts positively to.

Rapport creates **trust** between you and the audience. It increases your likeability, therefore potentially increasing the audiences' engagement, making it an enjoyable experience for everyone!

Building rapport helps you to **connect with the audience at a human level** – you are demonstrating that you understand them.

By taking a genuine interest in your audience, you will soon build a rapport with them, increasing their engagement and making strong connections.

Appropriate language




Humour

Use people's names




Encourage idle chat
